

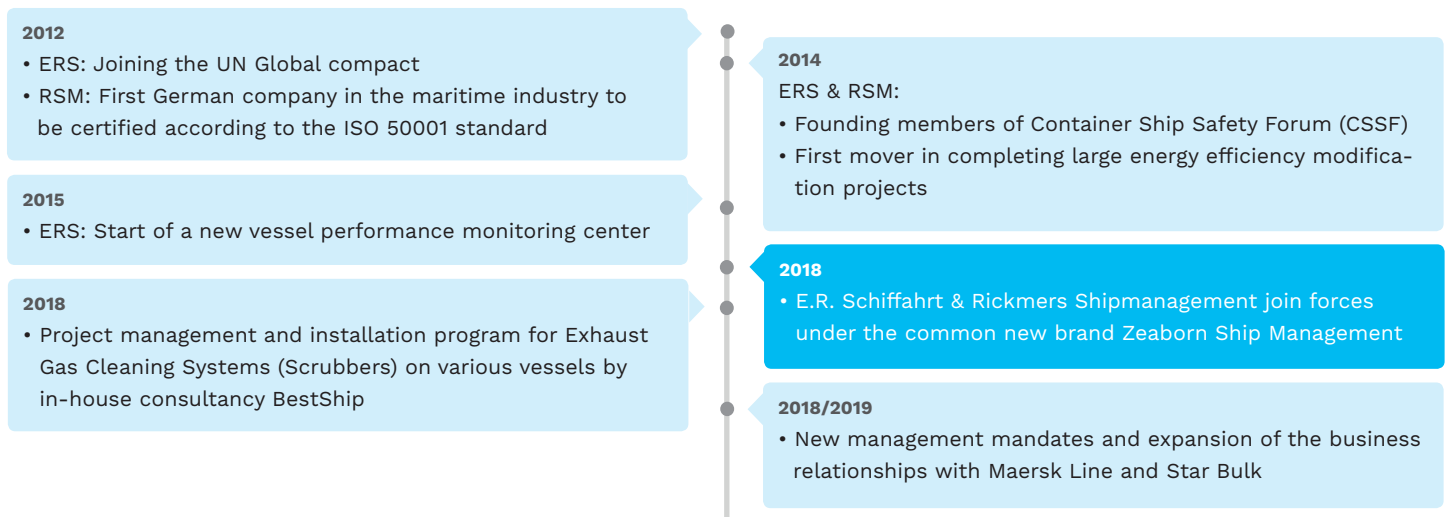

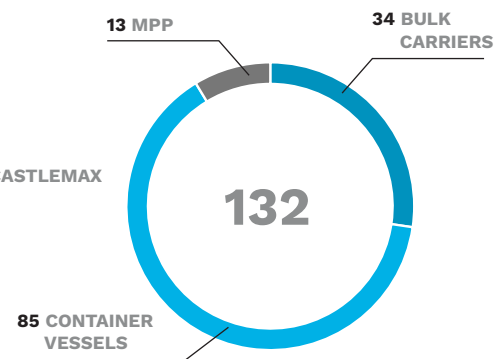
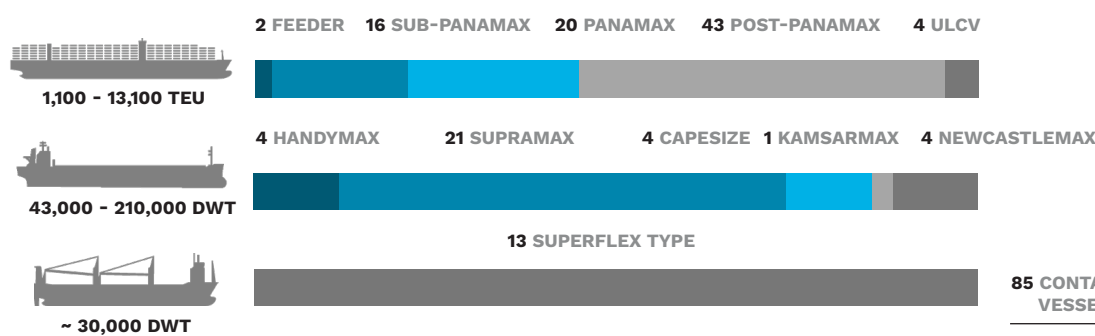

Schiffahrt (ERS) and Rickmers Shipmanagement (RSM), the company provides first-class, flexible and customized services in the container, bulk and multipurpose segment – be it technical or commercial management, crewing, financial or insurance and consulting services. The company offers analyzed data from its vessel performance monitoring center and reportings on an individualised KPI basis. Around 4,300 employees ashore and at sea are dedicated to securing safety, reliability and excellent results for Zeaborn Ship Management’s business partners worldwide. DNV GL

awarded the company with its ‘DNV GL Excellence – 5 Stars’ certificate for its exceptional safety, environmental and quality standards. In 2012, Zeaborn Ship Management’s predecessor E.R. Schiffahrt was the first German shipping company to join the UN Global Compact, a voluntary initiative to promote sustainable development. Predecessor Rickmers Shipmanagement was the first company in the maritime industry to be certified according to ISO 50001 standard. Moreover, both companies were founding members of the Container Ship Safety Forum (CSSF). Launched in 2014, the CSSF is a global business-to-business network to improve safety performance and management practices in the container shipping industry.
